 - Center is to replace existing Green Acres facility
 - Desired footprint is 30,000 40,000 SF which is approximately twice the size of the Sherwood Center
 - Include on Inventory and Site Assessment Diagram 40% undeveloped area of the park
 - Develop a diagram that places the community center on the site, as a one-story building with all surface parking and include additional area for construction needs i.e. what is the most expansive footprint that could be developed to provide and park a 40,000 SF building on the site, estimate cost to construct and to replace the park elements displaced; determine how 'big' the total footprint is and express its size in terms of known site features, such as the base of the bowl and have that measure available to use as an example should it come up in the discussion on April 6

Recap of Meeting with Father Whitestone

- Attendees Cathy, Brian, Elisabeth
- Balance security and openness of shared boundary
- Maintain informal relationships parking for tennis users, walking through site, occasional restroom use, but do not formalize such uses
- Discovery that some of the drive at the back of the church is City-owned; could be
 incorporated into a trail link that goes to the north and west of the school's athletic field
 along park-owned property

Recap of the April 6 Public Workshop

- · Reviewed notes assembled by L/KLA
- Reviewed notes sent by Tom Ross
- Additional observations from group's discussion and conversation amongst attendees as an outgrowth of that discussion
 - Park is invisible to many; or many residents are unfamiliar with the sections of the park on the hillside and lower portion along University Drive
 - Opportunity for trail connections behind St. Leo's
 - Restroom mixed interest; some wished for better access/signs for Police Station and Sherwood Center restrooms [what are the operating hours for each?] and others wished for permanent restrooms serving the park directly; Mosby Woods has permanent facilities for the park/soccer field
 - Did not hear community asking for wholesale change or big changes; peoples seemed supportive of 'tweaks' and improvements to what is there now
 - Importance of better incorporating the stream into the life of the park trails, boardwalks, interpretive exhibits (and if after restoration and water quality tests prove supportive, encourage play in the creek)
 - Desire expressed for Children's Garden specific such, not play areas issue is expense of construction and operation to do it well
 - Desire for additional plants ornamental and specific types of gardens such as pollinators/native/sensory – issue is expense of operation

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- Could sculpture or other features be incorporated that require less maintenance than ornamental display or feature gardens? Such as multiple sculptures sited along a trail segment?
- o Could the skate park be relocated behind the Police Station?
- How does the park present itself to the community, both on Old Lee Highway and on University Drive?
- NO water feature in the park it has been located instead in the heart of downtown
- Could the Farmer's Market that once was located in the park during the weekdays be cajoled into returning? Not on the weekend, but say on a Tuesday?
- This is a central green space, larger and with more offerings than a traditional neighborhood park, although it does serve the surrounding neighborhood as its neighborhood park (playground for example)
- o Programming special events how do you introduce people to this wonderful resource through special events without turning the park into a singular event hosting machine to the detriment of the most powerful and valued purpose of the park today in its encouragement of unstructured play?
- Structured events also can infringe on the park's use as a neighborhood resource
- Definitely need more shade structures in the park, both structures and tree plantings – particular need in playground area
- Stormwater management what area will be consumed by requirements to address stormwater management, if any? Unknown – Cathy and Elisabeth will follow up with Christina Alexander
- Issue of what can be inserted into the RPA and 100-year floodplain legally –
 Cathy and Elisabeth will clarify with Christina Alexander

- Cathy shared that Fairfax County and the City are meeting regarding potential shared redevelopment of the Willard site to incorporate the City's proposed community center.
- Cathy met with Dave Hodgkins to have an initial discussion on funding/financing options for the park improvements; further discussion to come for more detailed information
- Discussion on potential decking off police station parking lot

Follow up

- Identify potential locations for public art in the park; send to Jo who will share with Art Commission for their review and recommendation/approval
- Initiate Master Plan costing with RIB US Cost on final plan elements

Additional Products (check to see if included in scope)

 Useful to generate perspective image from Old Lee Highway - view of new entry and frontage of park; particularly of value if park activities are visible with view NOT dominated by relocated parking lot

1. Prefer layout of park elements as shown in Concept 2 with some tweaks

Site considerations

 Protect two sledding hills (entirety of the bowl and the area behind the police station used by older children and advanced sledders); ensure that a 'staging area' for sledders is protected at the top of the hill, not totally encroached upon by new parking spaces

 - o Minimum same number of spaces @ 83, better to have several more why moving? What is gained?

- Show bubble at entry for vehicles similar to how pedestrian entries are notated
- Need more specificity than current bubbles to explain proposals
 - Show actual parking lot configuration
 - Show trail network
 - Show area for skate park more specifically
 - o Reduce linearity of front streetscape/plaza

3. Master Plan Text

- Include protection of sledding hill(s) in text among short list of 'these park features won't change'
- Discuss concept of incorporation of public art, identify potential location for inclusion
- Discuss style and character of desires elements such as playground equipment what kind of space is wanted – experiential, art/sculptural, natural, openended rather than single activity usable equipment
 - Cathy shared Canadian vendor catalog Dynamo Playgrounds Creative Concepts, rep'd by firm out of North Carolina
- Describe character of plaza desired (people not clear on what is implied with term 'plaza')
 - o Include ping pong tables or similar activities

 - Accotink Creek could start essentially as a Phase 1, but comes from different office and funding stream
 - Easy first actions would be to upgrade and install the pedestrian entrances
 - University expand area where azaleas are today, move Van Dyck Park sign out to sidewalk side of bridge, add benches and welcoming feel
 - Cornwall Road entrance start with mulch soft path at first to get the trail established
- Three potential locations to provide additional parking
 - o Decking over police parking lot
 - Willard site redevelopment
 - Small lot above sledding hill
