
### **George Snyder Trail**

The festival kicked off on Friday night with the 2nd Annual Liquid Chocolate tent in Old Town Square from 6pm-8pm this event interest grew from last year and was very popular on Friday night and Saturday, Saturday, February 3rd was a cold but sunny February day. This is the main event day for the festival and it went very smoothly on all

fronts starting with the Pancake Breakfast at Fire Station 3 and continuing throughout the day with all of the other events. The Taste of Chocolate was a little slow at the start of the day but very consistent, the numbers increased starting around noon to there normal anticipated packed house numbers.
