Provide Convenient and Safe Accessibility and Connectivity

- 1. Improve mobility by designing and completing a grid of streets and shortening blocks for easier walking, while creating internal pathways / wayfinding where appropriate
- 2. Ensure a safe and comfortable walking environment
- 3. Create wayfinding plans to make navigating by vehicle and foot clear and convenient
- 4. Replace surface parking with parking structures and convenient on-street parking

Next Steps for the September 26 meeting:

- Finalize goal for Goal 5: Create Unique Experiences
- Develop summary statement/sentence that explains each Guiding Principle
- Review overall work product Vision, Guiding Principles, and Goals and make any final tweaks

Summary: Work Completed to Date

<u>Vision for Old Town</u>: A vibrant destination for all people to connect, innovate, and share unique experiences

Guiding Principles:

1. Build Strong Partnerships (w/GMU, Fairfax County, State, etc.)

- Bring GMU into Old Town and create a partnership that provides redevelopment, education, and places to live for students, faculty, staff, and City residents
- Create a transportation plan between the City and GMU
- Encourage incubator space create innovation and maximize research opportunities
- Create a strong liaison with the state to benefit infrastructure, business development, and tourism

2. Grow Business

- Substantially increase funding for and provide incentives to increase the variety of independent retail shops and businesses
- Increase the City's resources to support business owners
- Explore grant programs and other state and federal funding opportunities
- Establish entertainment anchors to activate Old Town and attract patrons on evenings and weekends
- Increase residential density in Old Town to support the Old Town business community

3. Enhance Culture

- Partnership with GMU to attract multiple entertainment venues
- Partnership with Fairfax County to enhance historical interpretation
- Focus on utilizing technology to promote culture and history
- Create street art and building art program
