Senior Day Trip Prices to Increase Starting July 1

The CUE Bus is required to charge the actual charter fare rate for all city and non-city sponsored trips.

The Charter fare rate covers the actual full cost of using the CUE bus.

The CUE Bus funding is separate from the City general fund budget and all activity must be cost recovered. It is not permissible to wave or reduce charges for city or non-city trips.

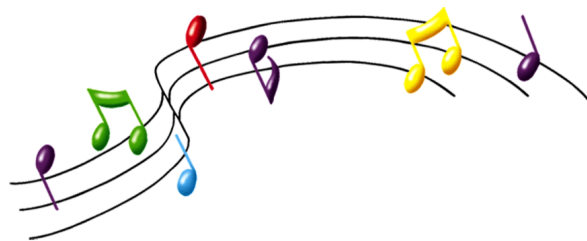
CULTURAL ARTS

The field users are the regular groups: FPYC and two adult groups. We are not able to issue permits to the other 6 adult groups because Draper is closed. The primary field space is Stafford and FHS Turf field. Stafford is not scheduled Monday thru Friday

because we do not have lights.

The gym permits are primarily issued to FPYC basketball with a couple spaces going to CYO.
