2020 Trail Projects



Fire Station 33 Trail

The City is proposing a new trail from Country Club Commons Park to Rt 50 at Plantation Parkway. Preliminary planning will be completed in order to apply for SmartScale funding. This project will help provide a North-South connection to the George Snyder Trail.

Daniel's Run Trail Extension

Funding for preliminary design is in place. We are waiting for the agreement between the Tank Farm property owners and the City to be updated to allow for a trail on the perimeter of their property. This trail will connect to Pickett Road and Main Street behind the water tank.
