Fairfax City Connected Care

The Fairfax City Connected Care Program is a joint project between the Parks and Recreation department with help from the Fairfax City School Board & Superintendent and support from the Mayor and City Council. This is a school-age child care and virtual learning center for children ages K-6th grade that live in Fairfax City. The Parks and Recreation We are operating the program out of the south wing of the Green Acres Community Center has been up and running since the first day of school, September 8.

Currently have 7 classrooms running with 57 kids registered for the program with kids from both Daniels Run and Providence Elementary. We are currently enrolling more students and can take up to 80 children. About 80% of these children are provided financial assistance through the CARES Act money and come from homes where English is not the first or primary language.

These children are in classrooms of no more then 10 children and two staff. They remain in their small groups throughout the day to keep small classrooms with little to no cross over for health safety. While they are at the program they get assistance with their virtual learning, and participate in recreational activities both indoors and outdoors.

We have gotten lots of positive feedback from parents and the schools about how much the children are enjoying the program and how impactful that program has been for the families that really need the program.

We plan on running the program for as long as it is needed and students are not back in school full time. As FCPS changes its school schedules we will adjust our program to fit the needs of the enrolled families.

Fairfax City Connected Care Book Donation Program

Staff started a book donation program for the Connected Care program after assessing a need to access to books for the children at Green Acres.

Our program supports many families in Fairfax City who may not have access to books at this time because their school library is closed! Our goal is to have a small library at our site that children can borrow books from to read!

People can donate used books that they are no longer using in our non-contact book donation box at Green Acres or purchase books from our amazon wish list that get sent directly to us at the center.

The book donation program was featured on ABC7 News!

We have currently collected over 200 books in just 1 week!





Little School at Sherwood

The Little School at Sherwood will be reopening its doors on October 1! We are excited to have 9 kids enrolled at this time with our 2 returning preschool teachers. It will be operating 3 days a week, Tuesday-Thursday with a 3 day and 2 day option for families.




