

"This Painting was created in the midst of the recent 2020 protests about Black Lives Matter. So much pain and so much suffering that needs to be addressed. To many lives lost and so many injustices ignored for way too long. I found this Microporous polyester film in the trash with a printed cave painting (upcycled art). I stretched the material on stretcher bars to paint on. I used this background, to create a piece that showed age with all hands of all colors represented. As humans beings we've tried to make connections through art forever. I am here! See me! I am important! I've made my mark! This piece is about the mark everyone makes on everyone's lives in all communities. City of Fairfax is a community that is looking for connection and unification through art. This piece would



represent that connection that "All Lives Matter". A Life is a Life, there is no difference what they look like. Public art is used as an avenue of sending a positive messages, about connection, about unification, and about change. This piece represents past and present human connection through art. Together we are united. "

The Cathedral Brass of Vienna Presbyterian Church, also performed a free concert titled "Americans We" with guest artist Graham Breedlove at Veterans Amphitheater. Mr. Breedlove is a trumpet soloist with the Army Blues jazz ensemble, part of The United States Army Band, "Pershing's Own" in Washington, DC. Together with Mr. Breedlove, the Brass performed a variety of classical, jazz, and popular favorites that celebrate the breadth and beauty of America's musical heritage. Featured works include Mr. Breedlove's New Orleans jazz arrangement of the gospel hymn Precious Lord, Take My Hand, Chicago's 25 or 6 to 4, Morton Gould's American Salute, and John Williams' Swing, Swing, Swing from the movie "1941".

All three concerts were presented through a grant from the Fairfax Commission on the Arts.

Gyms: We issued gym permits to FPYC basketball. COVID 19 regulations are in place and signs have been posted on all gym doors. Adult groups are not permitted in the gyms per FCPS. We are scheduling groups this summer at City Schools since Community Use will only allow NCS or the City of Fairfax to schedule. This will help FPYC and a summer league at FHS.
