

# Parks and Recreation December 2021 PRAB Report

#### **ARPA Spending Decision Possible on December 14th**

The City Council will consider the approval of a spending plan for 1/2 of the \$29 million of American Rescue Plan Act funding. Some of this funding is currently proposed to be for park improvements. IF approved by the City Council the first project to proceed will be the replacing of synthetic turf at Stafford Park. A contract with FieldTurf has been reviewed and will be ready for implementation on December 15th. The turf replacement will begin in March 2022.

The next project to move forward will be the hiring of consultants to proceed with a site plan and design for Thaiss Park and Van Dyck parks. It is likely that an Request for Proposal will be issued for both of these projects.

The main goals for Thaiss Park is to improve the park layout which may mean relocating the existing fields and condensing from 5 fields to 3 or 4 fields. Very preliminary work (see next page) was completed to see how many diamonds could fit at the park while improving the layout and appearance. This project may coincide with the construction of the Pickett Road Connector Trail.

Van Dyck Park has an adopted Master Plan. However, during the design process the Master Plan will be reviewed and updated. In addition to the park design the developers of Northfax West have started the design work on the stream restoration along the northern side of the park near University Drive. As part of the approval of Northfax West they agreed to restore the Accotink adjacent to Van Dyck Park.




## Lamb Center Celebrates 3 Years with the City Jobs Program
