

# FAIRFAX CITY Parks and Recreation March 2022 PRAB Report

## Willard Sherwood Health and Community Center Project Update

Public outreach for the concept phase of the Willard Sherwood Health and Community Center Project continued over the last several weeks. Outreach meetings were conducted with the Senior Center, Commission on the Arts, Board of Architectural Review, Fairfax Police Youth Club, Environmental Sustainability Committee, area schools and churches and adjacent HOA's. In addition approximately 500 surveys have been completed on Engage Fairfax. Grimm & Parker, the project architect, is working on providing the city and county with three concepts later this spring. Additional public outreach meetings will be scheduled once the concepts are complete.

Parks and Recreation staff have been involved with providing programming information, facility adjacency recommendations and collecting public input.

## **Thaiss Park Redevelopment Moves Forward**

The City has entered into a contract with Gordon to provide plans for Phase 1 of the Thaiss park redevelopment. This phase includes professional landscape architecture, preliminary engineering, conceptual architecture, and survey services. Design considerations include:

- Existing five (5) fields may be reduced to three (3) to provide appropriately sized fields to meet today's standards
- Propose improvements to field accessories such as batting cages, dugouts, netting etc.
- Improve and increase the size of the existing playground
- Renovate or propose a new press box, restrooms, and storage facility
- Improve traffic circulation and parking
- Make the park ADA accessible
- Address lighting of the fields
- Take site constraints into account such as the existing Resource Protection Area (RPA), 100 Year Floodplain (from city GIS information), severe runoff originating on land south of the park, and close proximity to nearby residential homes
