Section 15.2-2221 of the Code of Virginia and Section 2-235 of the City Code require that the Planning Commission submit an annual report to the City Council concerning the operation of the Commission and the status of planning in the City. The Planning Commission is pleased to provide the following information to the Council summarizing the Commission's activities during 2023 and the initiatives set forth in the City's 2035 Comprehensive Plan, both of which are in furtherance of the Council's goals.

#### **COMMISSION MEMBERSHIP**

The following members served on the Planning Commission in 2023: Mark Angres (Chair), Anthony Coleman, Paul Cunningham, Amir Eftekhari, James Feather (Vice Chair; Chair), Kirsten Lockhart (Vice Chair), Matthew Rice, and Kevin Denton.

On January 9, 2023, Mark Angres was re-elected Chair and James Feather was re-elected Vice Chair. James Feather was re-appointed to serve as the Planning Commission's representative to the Board of Architectural Review. Matthew Rice was re-appointed to serve as the Commission's representative to the Parks and Recreation Advisory Board. After Mark Angres stepped down, James Feather was elected Chair and Kirsten Lockhart was elected Vice Chair on April 24, 2023.

#### 2035 COMPREHENSIVE PLAN COMPLETED ACTIONS

Of the 288 action items in the 2035 Comprehensive Plan, many are underway and 17 are substantially complete. Those completed include the study and implementation of the bikeshare program, the adopted Bicycle Masterplan, the completion of the Housing Assessment, and trail connections to the planned I-66 facility. It should also be noted that 188 items are Ongoing.
