# A Message from Mayor Read,

In 2022 the City of Fairfax realized our Fall Festival, held annually on the second Saturday of October, would fall on Yom Kippur in 2024. Much discussion ensued about moving the event and ultimately it was decided to leave it on its regularly scheduled Saturday.

We make every effort to schedule around religious holidays, recognizing that in such a multicultural region there are many faith communities whose members seek accommodations for their observances. We understand the significance of Yom Kippur to the Jewish community.

Some of the considerations around our decision was the limited number of weekends in a year and moving it up a week or back a week meant we now overlapped with other area events. Vendors who come to our event annually plan their schedule well in advance and moving the date would force them

to choose among multiple events on the same weekend.

The nature of religious holidays that move around the calendar mean conflicts will occur periodically. We make every reasonable effort to move events if we can. We value the many faith traditions celebrated in our city and a scheduling conflict such as this does not mean we have not considered the impact. We strive to meet the needs of many faith traditions as well as our civic obligations to the wider community. We appreciate your understanding in this.

# Fairfax City Brings Home WIN


# Fairfax City defeats Town of Vienna and Town of Herndon to bring home first win in the Mayors Fitness Challenge!
